

Early Risers—Those folks who get up earlier in the morning are less likely to have major depression. A study of almost 840,000 adults in their 40s through 60s indicated that those who got up at 6 a.m. had a 23% lower depression risk compared to those who woke at 7 a.m. Early birds may get more morning sunshine, which often boosts mood, or "may be more in sync with the routines of others in their lives." This information appeared in JAMA Psychiatry, May 26, 2021. (Consumer Reports On Health, September 2021: p. 3)

Boosting Brainpower

As social activity increases post-pandemic (or at least post-isolation), many seniors are reporting improvements in memory and thinking. Joel Salinas, MD, NYU Grossman School of Medicine, and others suggest that there are key activities to help memory. First, monitor your health. Not only should you keep up with routine medical appointments, you should review your medications. Second, keep moving. Physical activity increases blood flow to the brain. Something as simple as walking can help. Focus also on strength and balance. Third, eat foods to maintain brain health. Fatty fish and olive oil are beneficial. Remember that vitamin B12, which is important for brain function, is not as efficiently absorbed in older adults. Have your doctor check your vitamin B12 levels and suggest a supplement if needed. Finally, do what you love. Look for activities that stimulate you and offer a social component. (Consumer Reports On Health, September 2021: pp. 4-5)
