Surprising Places Where Germs Live

We think we know all about germy places; however, here are a few you may not have thought about. Spice containers can harbor germs. Wash your hands before you cook and after handling raw meat. And wipe those spice shakers. The microwave control pad should be wiped with mild soap and water. Don't spray with cleaner. Whirlpool bathtubs can harbor bacteria in the jets. Use a special sanitizing cleaner. Because the laundry room is a moist, warm environment, it can be a source of bacteria and mold. Use a fan or a dehumidifier in that area. Legislative Update, Denise Deltondo and Jeff McClain, Chairpersons

The recipient of the free lunch for the October meeting is Janet Burkey.

Please write to Sandra O'Brien and Nick Santucci urging them to reverse the STRS takeover. In the state budget (House Bill 96), the majority party in the legislature passed a provision that radically changes the composition of the STRS Board. It removes four members of the Board elected by active and retired teachers and replaces them with four political appointees. This shifts the majority of the Board away from those who represent the active and retired educators of Ohio. It also prevents members of the system from serving as Chair or Vice Chair of the Board. This is a direct attack on the voice of educators and the ability for them to have a meaningful say in the direction of their own pension plan. Here is some important information: 1) A change in the STRS Board composition was not included in the budget bill as initially passed by the House or Senate. It was added to the conference committee report by the majority party members of the HB 96 Conference Committee at the eleventh hour without the opportunity for public debate. 2) This is a direct attack on Ohio's teachers. Of the state's five public retirement systems, only STRS was targeted. Only Ohio's public teachers had their ability to set the direction of their pension system stripped away. 3) STRS investments are performing well, and the system is well within the financial metrics established by state law. 4) This is yet another attack on the voice of educators. The legislature has also undercut educator collective bargaining rights, removed elected members from the State Board of Education, and continues to come up short in funding our public schools.

STRS Ohio posted a net total fund return of 10.4% for the year ended June 30, 2025. The fund ended fiscal year 2025 with \$100.6 billion in investment assets. Meketa, our investment consultant, shared that for the five-year period ending June 30, 2025, the total fund earned a net annualized return of 10.3%; its performance ranked in the top 11% of pension funds across the country.
