Summer into Autumn Tips



Here are some suggestions for a safe transition. Be visible and tidy. Add bright LED bulbs in hallways, staircases and entryways. Keep indoor and outdoor walkways clear – watch for hoses, loose rugs, or wet leaves. Strengthen your base. Wear supportive shoes with non-slip soles – even indoors. If needed, use a cane or walker with proper tips for extra balance. Add supports. Install handrails on both sides of stairs and entry areas. Add grab bars in bathrooms alongside toilets and in showers. Stay warm and comfortable. Dress in layers. Perhaps a cozy cardigan, socks or slippers to keep out the chill. Be sure your socks or slippers have treads on the soles to avoid slipping. Consider doing gentle strength and balance work. Try simple exercises such as chair stands, Tai Chi, heel-to-toe walking, or gentle leg lifts a few times each week. (Shane Owens, RN NR-P | EMS Coordinator, help4seniors.org)

Vaccine Recommendations

Standard suggestions for older adults include: Flu Vaccine, yearly (October is a good time.) Tdap Vaccine, once, repeated every 10 years, Covid 19, yearly, depending on risk factors and age. Talk to your provider about the Pneumococcal Vaccine, as there are two different types. After age 50, it is wise to get the Shingles Vaccine, two doses, two to six months apart. RSV Vaccine is new and at this time, you should talk to your provider. (cdc.gov/vaccines)

STRS/Legislative Information as of Newsletter Press Time The STRS Investment Committee reported at the October 15, 2025, board meeting that the preliminary net total fund return for September was up 1.9 percent. At the close of business on September 30, total fund assets were \$104.1 billion, approximately \$3.5 billion higher in just the past three months while paying \$2 billion in benefits to members. Despite the excellent growth in assets, STRS liabilities continue to grow because of increasing teacher pay, COLAs, the reduction in years of service for unreduced pension benefits, and other benefit improvements/restorations. Cheiron, the board's external actuary, reported an increase in the pension fund's amortization period from 10.1 to 11.8 years. Because of the preliminary injunction issued as a result of the lawsuit filed by OEA, OFT, and the Ohio Conference of American Association of University Professors challenging HB 96's elimination of educator representation on the STRS Board, the restructuring of the STRS Board has been barred, and the current Board will continue to oversee the STRS Pension Fund until a final ruling is made. ORTA supports this lawsuit but has not financially contributed to its filing. Dr. Rudy Fichtenbaum was elected STRS Board chair and Pat Davidson, vice chair.

The trial investigating misconduct against Board member Dr. Rudy Fichtenbaum and former Board member Wade Steen began on October 27 in Columbus. The suit alleges the two acted without the best interests of educators in mind and is the result of a 14-page anonymous letter alleging the two had improperly schemed to steer money from the pension fund to investment firm QED. It has since come to light that the chief legal counsel for STRS was partially behind the anonymous letter. The Board ultimately declined any investments from QED, but Ohio Attorney General David Yost filed civil claims regardless. The State of Ohio now wants a judge to bar Fichtenbaum and Steen from ever serving on a public pension board again.
